On Friday, March 20, 2026, a student reported to the university that they were sexually assaulted inside a resident room at Joe Greene Hall on Thursday, March 12, 2026, by a male they met on a social media or dating app. The victim provided information that the suspect was a 25-27 year old, non-student, 5' 9" Indian male, who sometimes hangs around the area of the Music Building pretending to be a student for the purpose of meeting people.

The UNT Police Department is investigating this incident and may already have sufficient information to identify the suspect. There is no further information to share at this time. Sexual assault is not the fault of the survivor. Only a perpetrator can prevent sexual assault. Crime alerts are intended to help the UNT Community stay safe by sharing information about how perpetrators are potentially preying on victims.

UNT has a full-time survivor advocate available to any student who has been a victim of violence. The survivor advocate can make safety or academic accommodations, as well as assist with medical attention and/or counseling needs. Safety Precautions

- Social Media Apps, including dating apps, have been used to perpetuate crimes and scams. Be cautious of unknown parties while using these apps and attempt to arrange meetings in a safe public place.
- Immediately report suspicious or dangerous activity to the police by dialing 911.
- Trust your instincts. If a situation feels wrong or dangerous, it may be. Get away, call for help and listen to your instincts.
- Always be aware of your surroundings.
